Revival Now!

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Introduction

Many years ago, when I lived in Ohio, we experienced a prolonged drought. Initially, extra watering of the grass and plants maintained some of the greenery around my home. Wherever the hose reached, it was green. But beyond that, the plants increasingly died off. Later, additional water restrictions came that eventually prohibited all watering. I adjusted my life accordingly. One of the extreme measures adopted to preserve a few plants was employing used bathwater to water them. By that time the lawn looked dead, the trees were losing their leaves and the unmerciful cloudless sky seemed to mock the many earnest pleas for rain. Then one day the lifegiving, landscape-changing rains came. Where before everything around the house had been drab and dry, suddenly there was a spontaneous explosion of greenery all around. Needless to say, I was rejoicing and praising God.

Our church is experiencing a similar lack of life-giving spiritual "rain." Responding to the lack, denominational leaders, pastors and thousands of members have been crying to God for spiritual rain multiple times per day. Directives for prayer have been urged. Special meetings have been organized. Faithful members have come together to seek Heaven's blessings. Pastors have adjusted their preaching schedules to focus more on revival and the Holy Spirit. Prayer phone lines have stayed busy. Sabbath School Quarterlies focusing on revival have been prepared and carefully studied. Our presses have churned out many helpful books on the subject. The church has developed special web sites that provide much helpful information.

In spite of these sincere efforts, in too many cases the prayers going up have apparently gone unanswered. Yes, there was a bit of an answer here and there, but it wasn't the reviving rain that was anticipated—it wasn't the spontaneous downpour of new life and power that seemed to be promised in the Scriptures and the Spirit of Prophecy. Like my hose back in Ohio that maintained greenery wherever it could reach, limited by my willingness to get out and water, so the church has only experienced limited blessings, and

those blessings have often been constrained by the willingness of the pastor and members to continue busily pursuing them. What is needed is a spontaneous explosion of blessing similar to what came when the rains arrived when I lived in Ohio.

Why has the rain been withheld? It is promised in Scripture and the Spirit of Prophecy. It has been experienced in the history of the church. It has been experienced at various times in our own denomination. But we would be hard pressed to say we are experiencing it now. So the question comes, "Why not now?" Is God unaware of the need? Is God unable to send the desired blessings? Is God unwilling to help for some reason?

The cry of "why" has often been raised. In the Old Testament the people questioned why God had seemingly ignored their fasting and afflicting of soul (Isa. 58:3; Mal. 3:14). The same question is still asked in our day.

In studying the Scriptures about God's chosen people in the Old Testament I have been awed by God's tender love, displayed against the backdrop of a rebellious and idolatrous people. God delivered them from Egypt, established them in the promise land, drove out their enemies, prospered them, gave them peace, and cared for them in ways that would have been unimaginable in Egypt. But regardless of God's blessings, His chosen people frequently turned their backs on Him, joined themselves to idols, adopted heathen customs and came to live in ways that even repulsed their heathen neighbors. In response God sent messenger after messenger with messages of mercy, begging them to return to their privileged status as His treasured people. But they closed their ears, hardened their hearts and stubbornly chose to pursue happiness and well being in ways that were often contrary to what God was saying. A summary statement on their condition is found in 2 Chron. 36:15,16: "They mocked the messengers of God, despised His words, and scoffed at His prophets, until the wrath of the Lord arose against His people till there was no remedy."

In considering the history of our denomination, we were also raised up by God and established in miracle ways. God has prospered us as a people. God has given us much peace and favor. He has also blessed us with a messenger who came with messages of love, mercy, admonishment, and much detailed information on how to know and experience the full blessings of God. We have been blessed.

In studying I have been reminded that the enemy of souls has constantly tried to sidetrack and derail us from following the pathway set out by God. In mercy God sent specific messages to help us get back on track. Sometimes the messages were heeded and resulted in renewed blessings and prosperity. Sometimes the messages were resisted—even rejected, and sad consequences followed. It seems we have minimized the importance of the messenger. I see a cautionary tale in Naaman's experience, whose healing was dependent upon his completely obeying the message of the designated messenger. Are we following the messages of the designated messenger in our day?

The one giving the messages now rests in the grave, but the messages given retain their full force. In carefully reading those messages one begins to find answers on why the spiritual rain is not falling.

Here are some findings.

Our condition is worse than most of us believe!

"What greater deception can come upon human minds than a confidence that they are right when they are all wrong! {3T 252.4}

"I have been shown that many are flattering themselves that they are good Christians, who have not a ray of light from Jesus." {3T 253.1}

Our rejection of the messages is a primary reason for our failings!

"I have been shown that the greatest reason why the people of God are now found in this state of spiritual blindness is that they will not receive correction. Many have despised the reproofs and warnings given them." {3T 255.1}

"I have been shown that unbelief in the testimonies of warning, encouragement, and reproof is shutting away the light from God's people. Unbelief is closing their eyes so that they are ignorant of their true condition." {3T255.3}

There is much hope! God is willing and waiting to bring revival!

"A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs. To seek this should be our first work. There must be earnest effort to obtain the blessing of the Lord, not because God is not willing to bestow His blessing upon us, but because we are unprepared to receive it. Our heavenly Father is more willing to give His Holy Spirit to them that ask Him, than are earthly parents to give good gifts to their children." {1 SM 121.1}

God has also given clear instructions on how to obtain revival.

But it is our work, by confession, humiliation, repentance, and earnest prayer, to fulfill the conditions upon which God has promised to grant us His blessing." {1 SM 121.1}

In this booklet I endeavor to share what it means to pursue revival through confession, humiliation, repentance and earnest prayer. I have chosen to somewhat follow the sequence that was followed during the course of the revivals experienced in Battle Creek and South Lancaster in 1888 and 1889, that began with lifting up Christ.

In the booklet, I have chosen to share the Scriptures and Spirit of Prophecy quotations with little commentary of my own. To facilitate discussion, I have chosen to use line numbers instead of page numbers.

Some of the things shared are strong medicine. They were hard for me to read; they may be hard for you to read. They provide accurate information on our condition. Other quotations give clear direction on how to experience life-changing, revival-bringing transformation. So, keep reading!

We also learn that apart from Christ we don't have the strength to overcome the slightest temptation. Only Christ has that power. So, please do not be discouraged as you read. Instead of lamenting your weakness, look to Jesus and rejoice that in obeying, new, transforming moral power will be yours!

And remember, in seeking revival we are not trying to work our way into heaven, for salvation from first to last is His gift. *The Compiler*

They do not take up the cross and follow Christ in 170 the path of self-denial and sacrifice. Almost Christians, yet not fully 171 Christians, they seem near the kingdom of heaven, but they cannot 172 enter there. The enemy of God and man is not willing that this 189 truth should be clearly presented; for he knows that if the people 190 receive it fully, his power will be broken. {RH, December 24, 1908 par 2} 191 It was possible for Adam, before the fall, to form a righteous character by 192 obedience to God's law. But he failed to do this, and because of his sin our 193 natures are fallen and we cannot make ourselves righteous. Since we are 194 sinful, unholy, we cannot perfectly obey the holy law. We have no 195 righteousness of our own with which to meet the claims of the law of 196 God. But Christ has made a way of escape for us. He lived on earth 197 amid trials and temptations such as we have to meet. He lived a sinless 198 life. He died for us, and now He offers to take our sins and give us His 199 righteousness. If you give yourself to Him, and accept Him as your 200 Saviour, then, sinful as your life may have been, for His sake you are 201 accounted righteous. Christ's character stands in place of your 202 character, and you are accepted before God just as if you had not 203 **sinned**. {SC 62.2}

204 All who have a sense of their deep soul poverty, who feel that they have 205 nothing good in themselves, may find righteousness and strength by looking 206 unto Jesus. He says, "Come unto Me, all ye that labor and are heavy-laden." 207 Matthew 11:28. He bids you exchange your poverty for the riches of His 208 grace. Family prayer, public 300 prayer, have their place; but it is secret communion with God that 301 sustains the soul life. {RH, December 31, 1908 par. 10} 302 You will receive more strength by spending one hour each day in 303 meditation, and mourning over your failings and heart-corruptions, 304 and pleading for God's pardoning love, and the assurance of sins 305 forgiven, than you would by spending many hours and days in studying 306 the most able authors, and making yourself acquainted with every objection 307 to our faith, and the most powerful evidences in favor of our faith {RH, 308 January 19, 1864 par. 19} 309 "When every other voice is hushed, and in quietness we wait before 310 Him, the silence of the soul makes more distinct the voice of God. He 311 bids us, 'Be still, and know that I am God.' Ps. 46:10. Here alone can true 312 rest be found. And this is the effectual preparation for all who labor for 313 God. Amid the hurrying throng, and the strain of life's intense 314 activities, the soul that is thus refreshed will be surrounded with an 315 atmosphere of light and peace. The life will breathe out fragrance, and 316 will reveal a divine power that will reach men's hearts." {DA 363.3}

317 How shall this victory over the world be obtained? Go to your closet, 318 dear reader, and there plead with God: "Create in me a clean heart, O 319 God, and renew a right spirit within me." Be in earnest; be sincere; 320 Jacob-like, wrestle in prayer. Do not leave your closet until you feel 321 strong in God. Remain until unutterable longings for salvation are 322 awakened in your heart, and the sweet evidence is obtained of

- 330 your godly life, you may shine as a light in the world. When you 331
- sincerely feel that without the help of God you perish, when you pant after 332

- 335 Many, even in their seasons of devotion, fail of receiving the blessing of
- 336 real communion with God. They are in too great haste. With hurried
- 337 steps they press through the circle of Christ's loving presence, pausing
- 338 perhaps a moment within the sacred precincts, but not waiting for counsel.
- 339 They have no time to remain with the divine Teacher. With their burdens
- 340 they return to their work. {Ed 260.3}
- 341 These workers can never attain the highest success until they learn the
- 342 secret of strength. They must give themselves time to think, to pray, to 343 wait upon God for a renewal of physical, mental, and spiritual power.
- 344 They need the uplifting influence of His Spirit. Receiving this, they will be
- 345 quickened by fresh life. The wearied frame and tired brain will be refreshed,
- 346 the burdened heart will be lightened. {Ed 260.4}

- Then, confident in their own supposed wisdom, men forsake the right way.

- 434 Why is it so hard to lead a self-denying, humble life? Because professed
- 435 Christians are not dead to the world. It is easy living after we are dead.

- 437 The new birth is a rare experience in this age of the world. This is the
- 438 reason why there are so many perplexities in the churches. Many, so
- 439 many, who assume the name of Christ are unsanctified and unholy. They
- 440 have been baptized, but they were buried alive. Self did not die, and
- 441 therefore they did not rise to newness of life in Christ. {6BC 1075.7}
- 442 We cannot retain self and yet be filled with the fullness of God. We

- 468 Those who work for God are daily to empty the heart of self, that they
- 469 may be cleansed of their hereditary and cultivated tendencies to wrong.
- 470 They are to depend wholly upon Him who taught as never man taught.
- 471 Unless the soul temple is daily emptied of self, and prepared for the 472 reception of the Holy Spirit, self will rule the entire being. The words
- and acts will be tarnished with selfishness. Christ will not appear in the life.
- 474 There will be seen a self-confidence that is wholly inappropriate. {18MR

- 476 Let every one empty himself of the spirit of self-importance and receive
- 477 **the meekness of Christ.** {SpTB05 51.2}
- 478 The Lord bids us empty our hearts of the selfishness which is the root
- 479 of alienation. He longs to pour upon us His Holy Spirit in rich measure,
- 480 and He bids us clear the way by self-renunciation. When self is
- 481 surrendered to God, our eyes will be opened to see the stumbling stones
- 482 which our un-Christlikeness has placed in the way of others. All these
- 483 God bids us remove. {6T 43.2}
- 484 We cannot retain self and yet be filled with the fullness of God. We
- 485 **must be emptied of self**. If heaven is gained by us at last, it will be only
- 486 through the renunciation of self, and the receiving of the mind of Christ.
- 487 Pride and self-sufficiency must be crucified, and the vacuum supplied with
- 488 the Spirit and power of God. Are we willing to pay the price required of
- 489 us for eternal life? Are we ready to sit down and count the cost, and
- 490 conclude that heaven is worth the sacrifice of dying to self, of having
- 491 our will brought into perfect conformity with the will of God? Until we
- 492 are willing, the transforming grace of God will not be manifested upon
- 493 us. When we present our emptied nature to God, he will by his Holy
- 494 Spirit supply the vacuum made by the renunciation of self, and give us

- 496 No outward observances can take the place of simple faith and entire
- 497 renunciation of self. But no man can empty himself of self. We can only
- 498 **consent for Christ to accomplish the work.** Then the language of the soul
- 499 will be, Lord, take my heart; for I cannot give it. It is Thy property. Keep it
- 500 pure, for I cannot keep it for Thee. Save me in spite of myself, my weak,
- 501 unchristlike self. Mold me, fashion me, raise me into a pure and holy
- 502 atmosphere, where the rich current of Thy love can flow through my soul.

- It is not only at the beginning of the Christian life that this renunciation of self is to be made. At every advance step heavenward it is to be renewed.

- 553 that when called into active service, they may have an eye single to the
- 554 glory of God. ... The Lord brings his children over the same ground
- again and again, increasing the pressure until perfect humility fills the
- 556 mind, and the character is transformed; then they are victorious over
- self, and in harmony with Christ and the Spirit of heaven. {RH April 10,
- 558 1894, par. 2}
- 559 The very trials that test our faith most severely, and make it seem that
- 560 God has forsaken us, are designed to lead us nearer to Christ, that we
- may lay all our burdens at his feet, and receive the peace he will give us
- 562 in exchange. . . . When you surrender yourself entirely to God, when

- 563 you fall all broken upon Jesus, you will be rewarded by a victory, the 564 joy of which you have never yet realized. As you review the past with a 565 clear vision, you will see that at the very time when life seemed to you only 566 a perplexity and a burden, Jesus himself was near you, seeking to lead you 567 into the light. Your Father was by your side, bending over you with 568 unutterable love, afflicting you for your good, as the refiner purifies the 569 precious ore. When you have thought yourself forsaken, he has been near 570 you to comfort and sustain. - 582 The Father's presence encircled Christ, and nothing befell Him but that 583 which infinite love permitted for the blessing of the world. Here was His 584 source of comfort, and it is for us. He who is imbued with the Spirit of 585 Christ abides in Christ. Whatever comes to him comes from the Saviour. 586 who surrounds him with His presence. Nothing can touch him except 587 by the Lord's permission. All our sufferings and sorrows, all our 588 temptations and trials, all our sadness and griefs, all our persecutions and 589 privations, in short, all things work together for our good. All experiences 590 and circumstances are God's workmen whereby good is brought to us. {MH 591 488.4}
- 592 By God's mighty cleaver of truth we have been taken from the quarry of the 593 world and brought into the workshop of the Lord to be prepared for a 594 **place in his temple.** In this work the hammer and chisel must act their part, 595 and then comes the polishing. Rebel not under this process of grace. You 596 may be a rough stone, on which much work must be done before you are 597 prepared for the place God designs you to fill. You need not be surprised 598 if with the hammer and the chisel of trial God cuts away your defects of 599 character. He alone can accomplish this work. And be assured that he 600 will not strike one useless blow. His every blow is struck in love, for 601 your eternal good and happiness. He knows your defects, and works to 602 **restore**, **not to destroy**. He sends trials to you to make you strong to do and 603 to suffer for him. {RH, June 20, 1907 par. 4}
- 604 God's love for his church is infinite. His care over his heritage is unceasing. 605 He suffers no affliction to come upon the church but such as is essential 606 for her purification, her present and eternal good. He will purify his 607 church even as he purified the temple at the beginning and close of his 608 ministry on earth. All that he brings upon the church is test and trial 609 comes that his people may gain deeper piety and more strength to carry 610 the triumphs of the cross to all parts of the world. He has a work for all 611 to do. There must be constant enlargement and progress. The work must

- 612 extend from city to city, from country to country, and from nation to nation,
- 613 moving continually onward and upward, established, strengthened, and
- 614 settled. {KC 114.5}

- 638 The Lord Jesus loves His people, and when they put their trust in Him,
- 639 depending wholly upon Him, He strengthens them. He will live through

- 641 the soul a vital transfusion of Himself. He acts through their faculties and
- causes them to choose His will and to act out His character. With the apostle Paul they then may say, "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I

- 655 At the altar of self-sacrifice,—the appointed place of meeting between
- 656 God and the soul,—we receive from the hand of God the celestial torch,
- which searches the heart, revealing our great need of an abiding Christ.
- 658 When we feel our heart need, when we long after the quickening

- influence of the Holy Spirit, Christ draws nigh to us. Self is crucified.
- 660 Christ lives in us, and the power of the Spirit attends our efforts; then the
- 661 soul is refined and elevated. Light from the heavenly sanctuary shines upon
- 662 us, and we are enabled to exert an influence which is a savor of life unto
- 663 life. By a union with Christ, by living faith, we are privileged to enjoy
- 664 the efficacy of His mediation. We are crucified with Christ, buried with 665 Christ, risen with Christ, to walk in newness of life. {ST October 11,

- 667 "Without me ye can do nothing." It is at the peril of the soul that so many
- 668 feel able to work in their own finite wisdom. Without Christ we cannot 669 subdue a single sin nor resist the slightest temptation. It is connection
- 670 with a power that is almighty which will make us overcomers. Then let
- 671 everyone who comes to Jesus walk humbly, and feel daily that he needs a
- 672 power out of and above himself, to soften his stony heart; that he needs to
- 673 be melted over, that the dross of self may be consumed. The same power
- 674 that turned the water to wine at the marriage feast of Cana is able to
- 675 eradicate all evil from our nature, and to make us partakers of the 676
- **divine nature.** The very same power that made the leper clean can make the 677 heart pure, fit for the society of God, of angels, and of the redeemed host.

- Holy obedience will be found only in the righteousness which Christ 679 imparts to the believing soul. "As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself,

- 685 A union with Christ by living faith is enduring; every other union must
- 686 **perish**. Christ first chose us, paying an infinite price for our redemption;

- 688 But this union costs us something. It is a union of utter dependence, to
- 689 be entered into by a proud being. All who form this union must feel their 690 need of the atoning blood of Christ. They must have a change of heart. They
- 691 must submit their own will to the will of God. There will be a struggle with
- 692 outward and internal obstacles. There must be a painful work of
- 693 detachment as well as a work of attachment. Pride, selfishness, vanity,
- 694 worldliness--sin in all its forms--must be overcome if we would enter into a 695 union with Christ. The reason why many find the Christian life so
- 696 deplorably hard, why they are so fickle, so variable, is that they try to
- 697 attach themselves to Christ without first detaching themselves from

Hang your 721 helpless soul upon your Mediator. In and through Him, and Him alone, you 722 can come to God. . . . {2MR 24.4} 723 The Spirit was to be given as a regenerating agent, and without this the 724 sacrifice of Christ would have been of no avail. The power of evil had 725 been strengthening for centuries, and the submission of men to this 726 satanic captivity was amazing. Sin could be resisted and overcome only 727 through the mighty agency of the third person of the Godhead, who 728 would come with no modified energy, but in the fullness of divine power. It 729 is the Spirit that makes effectual what has been wrought out by the 730 world's Redeemer. It is by the Spirit that the heart is made pure. 731 Through the Spirit the believer becomes a partaker of the divine 732 nature. {RH November 19, 1908, Art. B, par. 5} 733 Transformation of character is wrought through the operation of the 734 Holy Spirit, which works upon the human agent, implanting in him, 735 according to his desire and consent to have it done, a new nature. The 736 image of God is restored to the soul, and day by day he is strengthened 737 and renewed by grace, and is enabled more and more perfectly to 738 reflect the character of Christ in righteousness and true holiness." {RH 739 September 17, 1895, par. 7} 740 Christ has promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to His church.... but like 741 every other promise, it is given on conditions. There are many who 742 believe and profess to claim the Lord's promise; they talk about Christ 743 and about the Holy Spirit, yet receive no benefit. They do not surrender 744 the soul to be guided and controlled by the divine agencies. We cannot 745 use the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is to use us. ... But many will not submit to 746 this. They want to manage themselves. This is why they do not receive the 747 heavenly gift. Only to those who wait humbly upon God, who watch for 748 His guidance and grace, is the Spirit given. Do not dishonor God by one expression of inefficiency and inability to overcome fully, entirely, and gloriously through Jesus Christ, who has died to redeem you, and make you a free man. Conquer, yes, conquer. Put your will every moment on the side of God's will. Think hopefully and **courageously.** In faith cry out against Satan, and looking unto Jesus who is the author and finisher of your faith, say, "Jesus, my Redeemer, I am weak. I cannot do anything without Thy special help. I hang my helpless soul on Thee." Then let your imagination dwell on the thought that you are in the presence of Jesus, walking with God, your life hid with Christ in God.... Then you will not glorify Satan by imagining yourself weak and helpless. You will keep yourself uplifted into a pure and holy atmosphere. You will receive the Holy Spirit as a comforter, as a sanctifier.... You will have a calm, restful spirit in God. You will say, "Jesus lives, and because He lives I will live also. He has conquered Satan in my behalf, and I will not be conquered by the devil once. I will not disgrace my Lord and Leader; but I will triumph in His holy name, and

If we believe in the power of Jesus' name, and present our petitions to God in His name, we shall never be turned away.... Our help cometh from God, who holds all things in His own hands. Our peace is in the assurance that His love is exercised toward us. If faith grasps this assurance, we have gained all; if we lose this assurance, all is lost. When we surrender all we have and are to God and are placed in trying and dangerous positions, coming in contact with Satan, we should remember that we shall have victory in meeting the enemy in the name and power of the Conqueror. Every angel would be commissioned to come to our rescue when we thus depend upon Christ rather than that we should be permitted to be overcome. {TMK 265.3}

An Instructive Testimony

One place we were laboring in America, and there was every youth in our college at South Lancaster, Massachusetts, converted as we were telling them the simple story of the cross, to come to Jesus just as they were. Such an experience. I missed the youth there one evening, and I inquired, "Where are they? They have been here, but they are not here now." Soon a whole class of them came in and took their seats. Then they got up and began to bear their testimonies--I have done wrong to

802 such a neighbor, I have done wrong to such a man, I have done this sin and 803 that and the other one--and another one stood up on his feet and bore his 804 confessions. They said, "I wanted to come to this meeting knowing that 805 I had removed the last stumbling block before my feet and the feet of 806 **others.**" What a testimony they bore. . . . {10MR 308.1,2} Now here is the 807 word before us. "According to His divine power." We have no strength, 808 we have nothing of ourselves, we are utter weakness. We cannot take 809 one step toward God unless His grace is working upon human hearts 810 and drawing us. Just as soon as we take the first step toward His mercy 811 and grace He advances toward us, He advances with His pardon and grace. 812 He takes away the sins of the world, and imputes to us His righteousness. 813 {10MR 308.4} Now we may think, "I did not feel just as I wanted to." 814 In that very meeting there was one that thought that he had received the 815 love of God as he never had received it before. The next morning he 816 came to the meeting and he got up. I knew in a moment something was the 817 matter. The light was not in his countenance. Said he, "Somehow I don't 818 feel as I did last night. Somehow I don't feel a nearness to God. I lost the 819 blessing." {10MR 309.1} "Where did you lose it, Brother R? Where did 820 you lose it?" "I can't tell." "You slept through the night and God guarded 821 you all night. Then what is the matter this morning?" Well, he did not 822 know. I will tell you. You have not educated yourself to believe in God 823 whatever feelings you have. Feeling is not your God, and it is no use for 824 you to offer sacrifice on the altar of feeling, for feeling and faith are just as 825 distinct from each other as heaven and earth, as the east is from the west. 826 {10MR 309.2} "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of 827 things not seen." Now faith walks the narrow plank, and walks till it 828 comes to the end, then steps right off onto nothing, as it were. Yet it is 829 everything. It is a mighty upholder. You walk the plank of faith and 830 you cannot see another step to go. You need not consult how you feel. 831 **Feeling has nothing to do with it.** Do I believe in God, that He is my God, 832 and that His promises will be verified to me? Then I go right about my 833 work. I never look or examine whether I have feeling or have no feeling. 834 I know what my duty is from the expressed will of God, and it is for me 835 to do it and do it intelligently. {10MR 309.3}

- 853 None will enter the holy city, the paradise of God, but as conquerors,—
- 854 those who have separated themselves from the world, and stood in
- 855 defense of the faith once delivered to the saints, and have fought the
- 856 good fight of faith, looking constantly to "Jesus, the author and finisher
- 857 of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross,
- 858 despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of
- 859 God." {RH August 25, 1885, par. 16}
- 860 Let us take the robe of His righteousness woven in the loom of heaven.
- 861 There is not a thread of humanity in that robe. It is the robe of Christ's
- 862 righteousness. Let us put it on right here. We want life. We want to give
- 863 the example of what Christ is and what we may be. Oh, that we might
- 864 manifest God to a fallen world. We may be purified so that we may wear
- 865 the robe of Christ's righteousness, and the crown of immortality. God
- 866 grant that this may be our lot; for Jesus loves us with a love that is infinite. 867

Do Not Take On False Yokes

- 881 John 8:36 "Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed."
- 882 Does He not tell us the truth when He says, "My yoke is easy"? If we
- 883 manufacture yokes for ourselves, as many are doing, we shall find them
- 884 extremely galling; but if we take the yoke that Christ has prepared for us, 885
- and become meek and lowly in heart, self will be hid with Christ in God.
- 886 This is the correct position for us to occupy. {2SAT 275.1}
- 887 We often think we are having a hard time in bearing burdens, and it is too
- 888 often the case, because God has not made any provision for us to carry
- 889 these burdens; but when we bear His yoke and carry His burdens, we can
- 890 testify that the voke of Christ is easy and His burdens are light, because He
- 891 has made provision for these. {5BC 1091.2}
- 892 Jesus invites you to lay down the yoke you have been bearing, which has
- 893 been galling your neck ... the load of self-love, covetousness, pride,
- 894 passion, jealousy, and evil surmising. Yet how closely do men clasp these 895 curses, and how loath are they to give them up. {4T 240.3}

917	"When you give up your own will, your own wisdom, and learn of Christ,
918	you will find admittance into the kingdom of God. He requires entire,
919	unreserved surrender. Give up your life for Him to order, mold, and
920	fashion. Take upon your neck His yoke. Submit to be led and taught by
921	Him. Learn that unless you become as a little child, you can never enter the
922	kingdom of heaven. {1SM 110.2}
923	Holiness is not rapture: it is an entire surrender of the will to God; it is
924	living by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God; it is doing the will of our heavenly Father; it is trusting God in trial, in darkness as well
925 926	as in the light; it is walking by faith and not by sight; it is relying on God
927	with unquestioning confidence, and resting in His love. {AA 51.2}
928	Holiness is constant agreement with God. {ST, June 21, 1905 par. 3}
929	Tromess is constant agreement with God. (51, vano 21, 1703 par. 3)
930	It Is Also A Yoke of Service
931	Matt. 10:8 "Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out
932	demons. Freely you have received, freely give."
933	Matt. 20:26-28 "And whoever desires to be first among you, let him be your
934	slave—just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve"
935	The yoke is an instrument of service. Cattle are yoked for labor, and the
936	yoke is essential that they may labor effectually. By this illustration Christ
937	teaches us that we are called to service as long as life shall last. We are
938	to take upon us His yoke, that we may be co-laborers with Him. {ST June
939	29, 1904 Par. 3}
940	If you will seek the Lord and be converted every day; if you will of your
941	own spiritual choice be free and joyous in God; if with gladsome consent of
942	heart to His gracious call, you come wearing the yoke of Christ,the yoke
943	of obedience and service,all your murmurings will be stilled, all your

- 944 difficulties will be removed, all the perplexing problems that now confront
- 945 you will be solved. {MB 101.3}
- 946 Whatever business engagements men may yoke up with, if Christians, they
- 947 must wear the yoke of duty to Christ. This is their allegiance. They are to
- 948 consider themselves bound by superior obligations. The Master, Jesus
- 949 Christ, has placed His yoke upon the neck of every disciple. The life
- 950 service is pledged to Him in accepting His yoke. Anything that will mar

- 960 We are to take his yoke of submission, restraint, and obedience, in
- 961 meekness and lowliness of heart. Those who yoke up with Christ will find

- 963 Meekness is a precious, Christian attribute. The meekness and lowliness of
- 964 Christ are only learned by wearing Christ's yoke. . . . That yoke signifies

- 967 seeking to elevate ourselves, and we forget that lowliness of mind is
- 968 **power.** Our Saviour's power was not in a strong array of sharp words that

- 980 heart, and he expects all his followers to catch his spirit of meekness and

Meekness will suffer 991 disappointment and wrong, and will not retaliate. {3T 335.1} 992 993 This Yoke Is Easy To Carry 994 John 16:33 "Be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." James 1:2-4 "My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, 995 996 knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience 997 have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking 998 nothing." 999 2 Cor. 4:17 "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working 1000 for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." 1001 It was the spirit of uncomplaining submission in which our Saviour did 1002 His duty that made His yoke easy and His burden light. They 1111 rejoiced in the sweetness of communion with saints. They were tender, 1112 thoughtful, self-denving, willing to make any sacrifice for the truth's 1113 sake. In their daily association with one another, they revealed the love 1114 that Christ had enjoined upon them. By unselfish words and deeds they 1115 strove to kindle this love in other hearts. {AA 547.3} 1116 But gradually a change came. The believers began to look for defects in 1117 others. Dwelling upon mistakes, giving place to unkind criticism, they 1118 lost sight of the Saviour and His love. They became more strict in 1119 regard to outward ceremonies, more particular about the theory than the 1120 practice of the faith. In their zeal to condemn others, they overlooked 1121 their own errors. They lost the brotherly love that Christ had enjoined, 1122 and, saddest of all, they were unconscious of their loss. They did not 1123 realize that happiness and joy were going out of their lives and that, having 1124 shut the love of God out of their hearts, they would soon walk in darkness. 1125 {AA 548.1 1126 1127 What Is The Situation In Our Day? 1128 Rev. 3:14-16 "I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot."

- 1133 Today there are few who are heartily serving God. The most of those
- 1134 who compose our congregations are spiritually dead in trespasses and

- complacently listened to the most solemn, soul-stirring truths, but they have
- 1137 not practiced them. They are less and less sensible of the preciousness
- and value of truth, because they neglect the practice of those things which are pleasing in the sight of God. The stirring testimonies of reproof
- which are pleasing in the sight of God. The stirring testimonies of reproof and warning do not arouse them. The sweetest melodies that come from
- God through human lips—justification by faith, and the righteousness of
- 1141 God through numan hps—justification by faith, and the righteousness of 1142 Christ—do not bring forth from them a response of love and gratitude. {RH

- 1144 We are living in a most solemn time. In the last vision given me, I was
- shown the startling fact that but a small portion of those who now profess
- 1146 the truth will be sanctified by it and be saved. Many will get above the
- simplicity of the work. They will conform to the world, cherish idols, and
- 1148 become spiritually dead. The humble, self-sacrificing followers of Jesus
- 1149 will pass on to perfection, leaving behind the indifferent and lovers of the
- 1150 world. {1T 608.3}
- 1151 Sins of a grave character are in our borders, and unless there is an
- awakening such as we have not seen for some time which will convict
- and convert professed Sabbath keepers, they will die in their sins; and
- the punishment of Sodom and Gomorrah will be light in comparison with
- those who have had great light and precious opportunities, but have been
- 1156 worldly minded, corrupt in thoughts and practices, and have not purified

- 1158 This is no time now to make excuses and blame others for our
- 1159 backslidings; no time now to flatter the soul: if circumstances had only
- been more favorable, how much easier for us to work the work of God.

- 1180 tenderness to one another. Will any give heed to the solemn admonition,
- 1181 "Turn ye, turn ye; for why will ye die?" Fall upon the rock and be
- 1182 broken; then let the Lord Jesus prepare you, mould and fashion you, as
- 1183 a vessel unto honor. Well may the people fear and tremble under these 1184
- words: "Except thou repent, I will come unto thee quickly, and will
- remove thy candlestick out of his place." What then? "If therefore the light 1185
- 1186 that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!" {PC 349.2}
- 1187 The church is like the unproductive tree, which, receiving the dew, and rain.
- 1188 and the sunshine, should have produced an abundance of fruit, but on
- 1189 which the divine Searcher finds nothing but leaves. Solemn thought for
- 1190 our churches, solemn indeed for every individual. Marvelous is the patience
- 1191 and forbearance of God, but "except thou repent," it shall be exhausted; the
- 1192 churches, our institutions, will go from weakness to weakness, from
- 1193 cold formality to deadness while they are saving, "I am rich and
- 1194 increased in goods, and have need of nothing."
- 1195 There is to be in the churches a wonderful manifestation of the power
- 1196 of God, but it will not move upon those who have not humbled
- 1197 themselves before the Lord and opened the door of the heart by
- 1198 confession and repentance. In the manifestation of that power which 1199 lightens the earth with the glory of God, they will see only something
- 1200 which in their blindness they think dangerous, something which will
- 1201 arouse their fears, and they will brace themselves to resist it. {RH Dec.

What Is Our Greatest And Most Urgent Need?

- 1206 Ps. 85:6 "Will You not revive us again, that Your people may rejoice in

- 1210 A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of
- 1211 all our needs. To seek this should be our first work. There must be earnest
- 1212 effort to obtain the blessing of the Lord, not because God is not willing
- 1213 to bestow His blessing upon us, but because we are unprepared to
- 1214 **receive it.** Our heavenly Father is more willing to give His Holy Spirit to
- 1215 them that ask Him, than are earthly parents to give good gifts to their
- 1216 children. But it is our work, by confession, humiliation, repentance, and
- 1217 earnest prayer, to fulfill the conditions upon which God has promised
- 1218 to grant us His blessing. A revival need be expected only in answer to
- 1219 **prayer.** {1SM 121.1}
- 1220 A revival and a reformation must take place, under the ministration of the
- 1221 Holy Spirit. Revival and reformation are two different things. Revival
- 1222 signifies a renewal of spiritual life, a quickening of the powers of mind
- 1223 and heart, a resurrection from spiritual death. Reformation signifies a
- 1224 reorganization, a change in ideas and theories, habits and practices.

1225 1226 1227 1228	Reformation will not bring forth the good fruit of righteousness unless it is connected with the revival of the Spirit. Revival and reformation are to do their appointed work, and in doing this work they must blend. —The Review and Herald, February 25, 1902. {1SM 128.1}

1349 1350	Ezek. 33:31 "with their mouth they show much love, but their hearts pursue their own gain."
1351	Luke 12:15 "And He said to them, 'Take heed and beware of covetousness,
1352	for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses."

1358	The sin which is indulged to the greatest extent, and which separates us
1359	from God and produces so many contagious spiritual disorders, is
1360 1361	selfishness. There can be no returning to the Lord except by self-denial. Of ourselves we can do nothing; but, through God strengthening us, we
1362	can live to do good to others, and in this way shun the evil of

selfishness.... {2T 132.1}

- 1364 All sin is selfishness. Satan's first sin was a manifestation of selfishness.
- 1365 He sought to grasp power, to exalt self. A species of insanity led him to
- seek to supersede God. And the temptation that led Adam to sin was Satan's
- declaration that it was possible for man to attain to something more than he
- already enjoyed, possible for him to be as God Himself. The sowing of seeds of selfishness in the human heart was the first result of the
- 1370 **entrance of sin into the world.** {WB, September 9, 1902 par. 3}
- 1371 Constant, self-denying benevolence is God's remedy for the cankering
- 1372 sins of selfishness and covetousness. God has arranged systematic
- 1373 benevolence to sustain His cause and relieve the necessities of the suffering
- and needy. He has ordained that giving should become a habit, that it
- may counteract the dangerous and deceitful sin of covetousness. **Continual**
- 1376 **giving starves covetousness to death**. Systematic benevolence is designed
- in the order of God to tear away treasures from the covetous as fast as they
- 1378 are gained, and to consecrate them to the Lord, to whom they belong....

- 1380 Some rich men feel like murmuring because the work of God is extending
- 1381 and there is a demand for money. They say that there is no end to the calls
- 1382 for means. One object after another is continually arising, demanding help.
- 1383 To such we would say that we hope the cause of God will so extend that
- there will be greater occasion, and more frequent and urgent calls, for
- supplies from the treasury to prosecute the work. {3T 389.3}
- 1386 Those churches who are the most systematic and liberal in sustaining

- 1390 They should understand that it is His mercy which multiplies the

1436	Self-Sufficiency And Excessive Confidence In Ourselves

Satan is alluring them to sin that they may be 1477 lost: God gives a clear presentation of their sins that they may repent 1478 and be saved. The greatest danger of the world is, that sin does not 1479 appear sinful. This is the greatest evil existing in the church; sin is 1480 glossed over with self-complacency. Blessed indeed are they who possess 1481 a sensitive conscience; who can weep and mourn over their spiritual poverty 1482 and wanderings from God; who are poor in spirit and can receive the 1483 reproof God sends them; and who, with confessions and brokenness of 1484 heart, will take their places, all penitent, in humiliation at the cross of 1485 Christ. {ST, June 15, 1876 par. 5} 1486 Oh, how many flatter themselves that they have goodness and 1487 righteousness, when the true light of God reveals that all their lives they 1488 have only lived to please themselves! Let the individual who is seeking to possess purity of spirit bear in mind that in Christ there is power to control the appetite. {9T 156.2}

1508 The subject of health reform has been presented in the churches; but 1509 the light has not been heartily received. The selfish, health-destroying 1510 indulgences of men and women have counteracted the influence of the 1511 message that is to prepare a people for the great day of God. If the 1512 churches expect strength, they must live the truth which God has given 1513 them. If the members of our churches disregard the light on this subject, 1514 they will reap the sure result in both spiritual and physical degeneracy. And 1515 the influence of these older church members will leaven those newly come 1516 to the faith. The Lord does not now work to bring many souls into the 1517 truth, because of the church members who have never been converted. 1518 and those who were once converted, but who have backslidden. What 1519 influence would these unconsecrated members have on new converts? 1520 Would they not make of no effect the God-given message which His people

1521 are to bear?—Testimonies for the Church 6:370, 371, 1900 (CD 455.2) 1522 Again and again I have been shown that God is trying to lead us back, 1523 step by step, to His original design,—that man should subsist upon the 1524 natural products of the earth. Among those who are waiting for the 1525 coming of the Lord, meat-eating will eventually be done away: flesh 1526 will cease to form a part of their diet. We should ever keep this end in 1527 view, and endeavor to work steadily toward it. I can not think that in the 1528 practice of flesh-eating we are in harmony with the light which God has 1529 been pleased to give us. All who are connected with our health institutions 1530 especially should be educating themselves to subsist on fruits, grains and 1531 vegetables. If we move from principle in these things, if we as Christian 1532 reformers educate our own taste, and bring our diet to God's plan, then 1533 we may exert an influence upon others in this matter, which will be 1534 pleasing to God. {TSDF 64.5} 1535 Vegetables, fruits and grains should compose our diet. Not an ounce of

flesh-meat should enter our stomachs. The eating of flesh is unnatural.
We are to return to God's original purpose in the creation of man. {TSDF

1539 Now in regard to milk and sugar: I know of persons who have become 1540 frightened at the health reform, and said they would have nothing to do 1541 with it, because it has spoken against a free use of these things. Changes 1542 should be made with great care; and we should move cautiously and wisely. 1543 We want to take that course which will recommend itself to the 1544 intelligent men and women of the land. Large quantities of milk and 1545 **sugar eaten together are injurious.** They impart impurities to the system. 1546 Animals from which milk is obtained are not always healthy. They may be 1547 diseased. A cow may be apparently well in the morning and die before

night. Then she was diseased in the morning, and her milk was diseased, but you did not know it. The animal creation is diseased. Flesh meats are

1550 diseased. Could we know that animals were in perfect health, I would

1551 recommend that people eat flesh meats sooner than large quantities of

1552	milk and sugar. It would not do the injury that milk and sugar do.
1553	Sugar clogs the system. It hinders the working of the living machine.—
1554	Testimonies for the Church 2:368, 369, 1870 (CD 330.3)

1557	Rom. 12:9 "Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to
1558	what is good."

1564	I have a straightforward testimony to bear in regard to [pictures illustrating

1568	choose to serve God. Years ago reproof was given our editors in regard to

1571	desire to continue to read novels. Through the reading of enticing stories
1572	they rapidly lose their spirituality. This is one of the principal causes of
1573	the weak, uncertain spirituality of many of our youth. {19MR 43.2}
1574	A love for fictitious reading should be broken up at once; and rigid
1575	rules should be enforced to hold the mind in a proper channel. The
1576 1577	pernicious practice of story-reading is one of the means employed by Satan to destroy souls. The mind that is occupied with exciting stories
1578	loses all relish for solid reading that would improve the memory and
1579	strengthen the intellect. {ST May 19, 1887 Par. 3}
1580	I am acquainted with many sad examples of the evil effects of this baneful
1581	practice. I have known persons of well-balanced minds, whom God had
1582	endowed with mental powers of no ordinary character, to take up the
1583	reading of romance; and the more they indulged the appetite for this
1584	kind of mental food, the greater was the demand. The imagination
1585	constantly craved its accustomed stimulus, as the inebriate longs for his
1586	wine or tobacco. Their mental and moral powers were weakened and

1589	the liquor drinker or the tobacco devotee. Novel-readers are mental

They need not be eaten cold 1650 unless preferred. But let no remarks be made as though it were a very 1651 light thing whether or not we regard the special requirements of God in

1653 God meant what He said when He gave these directions, and shall we, who are presenting to the people the claims of the divine law, break that law 1654 1655 ourselves, merely to please the appetite? God forbid. There has sometimes 1656 been almost as much cooking done on the Sabbath as on other days; 1657 and the blessing of God has been shut out by our failure to honor Him 1658 in keeping the Sabbath according to the commandment.— Undated 1659 Manuscript 88. {13MR 293.3}

1660 We should not provide for the Sabbath a more liberal supply or a 1661 greater variety of food than for other days. Instead of this the food 1662 should be more simple, and less should be eaten, in order that the mind 1663 may be clear and vigorous to comprehend spiritual things. Overeating 1664 befogs the brain. The most precious words may be heard and not 1665 appreciated, because the mind is confused by an improper diet. By 1666 overeating on the Sabbath, many have done more than they think to 1667 dishonor God. {CG 532.1}

While cooking upon the Sabbath should be avoided, it is not necessary to eat cold food. In cold weather let the food prepared the day before be heated. And let the meals, though simple, be palatable and attractive. Provide something that will be regarded as a treat, something the family do not have every day. {CG 532.2}

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In Our Dressing

Many need instruction as to how they should appear in the assembly for worship on the Sabbath. They are not to enter the presence of God in the common clothing worn during the week. All should have a special **Sabbath suit**, to be worn when attending service in God's house. While we should not conform to worldly fashions, we are not to be indifferent in regard to our outward appearance. We are to be neat and trim, though without adornment. The children of God should be pure within and without. {CG 531.2}

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In Our Activities

When I see how much might be done in such countries as I am now in, my heart burns within me to show to those who profess to be the children of God how much money they are wasting on dress, on expensive furniture, or selfish pleasures, in excursions merely for **selfish gratifications.** All this is embezzling the Lord's goods, using to please self that means that is wholly His and which should be devoted to

Your room may contain many little ornaments placed there for admiration: but if you would have an eye single to the glory of God, you would do well to pack away these little idols. In handling, dusting, and replacing them, many precious moments are spent that might be employed in **needful work.** But if these trinkets are not to be stored away, then you have another lesson to learn. Be expeditious. Do not dreamily take up every article, and keep it in your hand, as though loath to lay it down. It is the duty of those who are slow in their movements to improve in this respect. 1793	hair, wearing gold, or putting on fine apparel—rather let it be the hidden
1794	person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit,
1795	which is very precious in the sight of God."
1796	As I have seen those of our faith becoming worldly, my heart has been
1797	saddened. Some of those who profess to believe that they have the last
1798	message of mercy to give to the world, follow the fashions as far as they
1799	think their profession of faith will allow them to do. And their influence
1800	leads others astray. Their lack of Christlikeness is apparent to all. The
1801	Lord is dishonored by their conformity to the fashions of this
1802	degenerate age. Outward display is contradictory to our profession of
1803	faith. I entreat my sisters to guard against the tendency to dress in
1804	accordance with the demands of fashion. {RH November 17, 1904 Par. 3}
1805	Satan invented the fashions in order to keep the minds of women so
1806	engrossed with the subject of dress that they could think of but little

1808	Obedience to fashion is pervading our Seventh-day Adventist churches
1809	and is doing more than any other power to separate our people from
1810	God. I have been shown that our church rules are very deficient. All
1811	exhibitions of pride in dress, which is forbidden in the word of God, should
1812	be sufficient reason for church discipline. If there is a continuance, in face
1813	of warnings and appeals and entreaties, to still follow the perverse will, it
1814	may be regarded as proof that the heart is in no way assimilated to Christ.
1815	Self, and only self, is the object of adoration, and one such professed
1816	Christian will lead many away from God. {4T 647.2}
1817	Those who have bracelets, and wear gold and ornaments, had better
1818	take these idols from their persons and sell them, even if it should be
1819	for much less than they gave for them, and thus practice self-denial.
1820	Time is too short to adorn the body with gold or silver or costly
1821	apparel. {3SM 248.1}
1822	We do not discourage neatness in dress. Correct taste is not to be
1823	despised nor condemned. Our faith, if carried out, will lead us to be so
1824	plain in dress, and zealous of good works, that we shall be marked as
1825	peculiar. But when we lose taste for order and neatness in dress, we
1826	virtually leave the truth; for the truth never degrades, but elevates.
1827	When believers are neglectful of their dress, and are coarse and rough
1828	in their manners, their influence hurts the truth. "We are," said the
1829	inspired apostle, "made a spectacle unto the world, and to angels, and to
1830	men." All heaven is marking the daily influence that the professed followers
1831	of Christ exert upon the world. My sisters, your dress is telling either in
1832	favor of Christ and the sacred truth or in favor of the world. Which is

Before they realize what they are 2004 doing, the adversary has through them accomplished his purpose. - 2047 strife; and while these differences exist, God neither hears nor answers

- 2060 Definition: "A pleasurable occupation of the senses...."
- 2061 2 Tim. 3:4 "...lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God."
- 2062 Php. 4:8 "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatever things are
- 2063 noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things
- 2064 are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if
- 2065 there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things."
- 2066 Ps. 101:3 "I will set nothing wicked before my eyes;"
- 2067 Any amusement in which you can engage asking the blessing of God
- 2068 upon it in faith will not be dangerous. But any amusement which
- 2069 disqualifies you for secret prayer, for devotion at the altar of prayer, or
- 2070 for taking part in the prayer meeting is not safe, but dangerous. {AH
- 2071 513.3}

2072 In every school **Satan** has tried to make himself the guide of the teachers 2073 who instruct the students. It is he who has introduced the idea that selfish 2074 amusements are a necessity. Students sent to school for the purpose of 2075 receiving an education to become evangelists, ministers and missionaries to 2076 foreign countries, have received the idea that amusements are essential 2077 to keep them in physical health, while the Lord has presented before 2078 them that the better way is to embrace in their education manual labor 2079 in the place of amusements. This amusement question, if practiced, will 2080 soon become a passion that gives disrelish to useful, healthful exercise of 2081 mind and body, which makes students useful to themselves and others. 2082 {SpM 49.4}

2083 When the students at the school went into their match games and 2084 football playing, when they became absorbed in the amusement 2085 question, Satan saw it a good time to step in and make of none effect 2086 the Holy Spirit of God in molding and using the human subject, {1888 1211.1}

2088 Ask yourself, What bearing has the question of amusements on my 2089 religious life, on my character as a Christian? Do the games in which 2090 you participate, fit you to engage in prayer and in the service of God? 2091 Do they aid you to bring as much zeal and earnestness into the Lord's 2092 work as you put into the games you play? Have not these amusements in 2093 which you have engaged, absorbed your interest so that you have not been 2094 able to put as much fervor into the learning of your lessons as you should 2095 have done? Which is to have the supremacy,--the service of God, or the 2096 service of self? Let every student closely examine the ground on which he is 2097 standing. {YI, May 17, 1894 par. 7}

Cheap Conversation

- 2100 Eph. 5:4 "Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor coarse jesting, which 2101 are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks."
- 2102 The tenor of the conversation reveals the treasure of the heart. The 2103 cheap, common talk, the words of flattery, the foolish witticism, spoken 2104 to create a laugh, are the merchandise of Satan, and all who indulge in

2105 this talk are trading in his goods. {CT 340.2}

2106 All frivolity, all cheapness of conversation, all jesting and joking, 2107 weakens the soul, and weans the heart from prayer. Like Paul, the true 2108 followers of Christ will ever bear about in the body the dying of the Lord 2109 Jesus; they cannot keep in mind the sufferings of Christ for them, and yet be

2110 light and trifling. {GW92 233.1}

- 2111 But few realize that they drive away the Spirit of God with their selfish
- 2112 thoughts and feelings, their foolish, trifling talk. . . . If the grace of Christ 2113 were planted in their hearts, and striking its roots down deep into good soil,
- 2114 they would bear fruit of an altogether different character. {SD 316.4}
- 2115 There are those whom the truth finds coarse, rough, odd, boastful, who 2116 take advantage of their neighbors if they can, in order to benefit themselves.
- 2117 They err in many ways, yet when the truth is believed by them from the
- 2118 heart, it will work an entire change in their life. They will immediately
- 2119 commence the work of reformation. The pure influence of truth will

2120 elevate the whole man. In his business deal with his fellow men he will 2121 have the fear of God before him, and will love his neighbor as himself, and 2122 will deal just as he would wish to be dealt by. His conversation will be 2123 truthful, chaste and of such an elevating character that unbelievers 2124 cannot take advantage, or say evil of him justly, neither be disgusted 2125 with his uncourteous ways and unbecoming speech. He will carry the 2126 sanctifying influence of the truth into his family, and let his light so shine 2127 before them that they by seeing his good works may glorify God. He will in 2128 all the walks of life exemplify the life of Christ, {4bSG 156.1}

Compromise

2131 Deut. 18:9 "You shall not learn to follow the abominations of those 2132 nations."

2133 There is still, as with ancient Israel, a constant tendency among the 2134 professed people of God to depart from the Lord's instructions, and to 2135 imitate the customs and practices of worldlings. ... The Christianity 2136 which will yield to the influence of the world, and conform itself to their 2137 principles and customs, is looked upon with favor by men who are the 2138 enemies of God. But when the necessity for holiness of heart and life is 2139 presented, then the world feels that its rights are endangered. When the 2140 fashionable follies, church rebukes demoralizing amusements, 2141 extravagance, and self-indulgence; when Christianity is spiritual, 2142 positive, earnest, and aggressive,--then the opposition of the world will 2143 be excited. {ST, September 15, 1881 par. 3}

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Love Of Position And Authority

2146 Matt. 20:26 "Whoever desires to become great among you, let him be your 2147 servant."

It is a dangerous work to invest men with authority to judge and rule their fellowmen. Not to you nor to any other man has been given power to control the actions of God's people, and the effort to do this must be no longer continued. God has been dishonored by the education that has been given to the churches in Southern California in looking to one man as conscience and judgment for them. God has never authorized any man to exercise a ruling power over his fellow workers; and those who have allowed a dictatorial spirit to come into their official work need to experience the converting power of God upon their hearts. They have placed man where God should be. {SpM 413.4}

2157

2158 It is a wrong education to teach our people to lean on human aids, 2159 instead of going to the Lord in prayer. The enemy of souls has been the 2160 instigator of this, that minds might become obscured. The people are not to 2161 be instructed differently. God's people are to meet together in counsel, 2162 but no leader or worker is to take the position that God's children are 2163 to make no move until he is first consulted. Those who bear 2164 responsibilities in the work are to co-operate with heavenly angels in 2165 teaching men and women to look to God as the source of their strength.

2166 {SpM 415.3} There are some who desire to be a ruling power, and who need the sanctification of submission. God brings about a change in their lives, and perhaps places before them duties that they would not choose. If they are willing to be guided by Him, He will give them grace and strength

2171 to perform the objectionable duties in a spirit of submission and 2172 helpfulness. They are being qualified to fill places where their disciplined

2173 abilities will make them of the greatest service. {8MR 423.1}

2175 Partial Surrender

2176 Rom. 12:1 "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that 2177 you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is 2178 your reasonable service."

2179 2 Cor. 8:5 "...they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the

2180 will of God."

Until the heart is surrendered unconditionally to God, the human agent is not abiding in the true vine, and can not flourish in the vine, and bear rich clusters of fruit. God will not make the slightest compromise with sin. If he could have done this, Christ need not have come to our world to suffer and die. No conversion is genuine which does not change both the character and the conduct of those who accept the truth. The truth works by love, and

purifieth the soul. {1888 1310.2}

There are many who do not make an entire surrender. They do not die to self that Christ may live in them. They adopt His name, they wear His badge, but they are not partakers of His nature. They have not overcome their unholy ambition and their love for the world. They do not take up the cross and follow Christ in the path of self-denial and self-sacrifice.

Almost Christians, yet not fully Christians, they seem near the kingdom of heaven, but they can not enter there. **Almost, but not wholly saved, means**

2195 **to be wholly lost**. {ST January 6, 1904 par. 3}

When you give up your own will, your own wisdom, and learn of Christ as
He has invited you, then you shall find entrance to the kingdom of God.

Entire, unreserved surrender He requires. Give up your life for Him to
order, mold, and fashion; take upon your neck His yoke; submit to be
led and taught as well as to lead and teach; learn that unless you
become as a little child you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
Abide in Him, to be and do only what He wills. These are the conditions

2204 O parents, for the sake of yourselves, and your children, ... Set your own 2205 hearts in order, and work earnestly for your children. An unreserved 2206 surrender to God will sweep away the barriers that have so long defied 2207 the approaches of heavenly grace. When you take up the cross and 2208 follow Christ, when you bring your lives into conformity to the will of 2209 God, vour children will be converted. The world will take knowledge of 2210 them that they have been with Jesus and have learned of him. In word and 2211 deed they will bear witness to the power of Christ's grace. {RH, July 15, 2212 1902 par. 13}

2215 Matt. 5:14 "You are the light of the world"

2216 1 Tim. 3:15 "I write so that you may know how you ought to conduct

2217 yourself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the

- 2218 pillar and ground of the truth."
- 2219 Eph. 5:25-26 "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the
- 2220 church and gave Himself for her, that He might present her to Himself a
- 2221 glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she
- 2222 would be holy and without blemish."
- 2223 During ages of spiritual darkness the church of God has been as a city set on
- 2224 a hill. From age to age, through successive generations, the pure doctrines
- of heaven have been unfolding within its borders. Enfeebled and defective
- 2226 as it may appear, the church is the one object upon which God bestows
- in a special sense His supreme regard. It is the theater of His grace, in
- 2228 which He delights to reveal His power to transform hearts. {AA 12.1}
- 2229 The church is God's fortress, his city of refuge, which he holds in a
- 2230 revolted world. Any betrayal of her sacred trust is treachery to him
- 2231 who has bought her with the precious blood of his only begotten Son.
- 2232 {RH December 4, 1900, par. 5}
- 2233 God wants His people to be united in the closest bonds of Christian
- 2234 fellowship; confidence in our brethren is essential to the prosperity of
- the church; union of action is important in a religious crisis. One imprudent
- 2236 step, one careless action, may plunge the church into difficulties and trials
- 2237 from which it may not recover for years. One member of the church filled
- 2238 with unbelief may give an advantage to the great foe that will affect the
- prosperity of the entire church, and many souls may be lost as the result. Jesus would have His followers subject one to another; then God
- can use them as instruments to save one another; for one may not discern
- 2242 the dangers which another's eye is quick to perceive; but if the undiscerning
- 2243 will in confidence obey the warning, they may be saved great perplexities
- 2244 and trials. {3T 446.1}

Failing To Fulfill Our Distinctive Mission

- 2247 Isa. 5:1-4 "Now let me sing to my Well-beloved a song of my Beloved 2248 regarding His vineyard: My Well-beloved has a vineyard on a very fruitful
- 2249 hill. He dug it up and cleared out its stones, and planted it with the choicest
- vine. He built a tower in its midst, and also made a winepress in it; So He
- 2251 expected it to bring forth good grapes, but it brought forth wild grapes.
- 2252 "And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, judge, please,
- 2253 between Me and My vineyard. What more could have been done to My

- 2256 Matt. 21:19 "And seeing a fig tree by the road, He came to it and found
- 2257 nothing on it but leaves, and said to it, 'Let no fruit grow on you ever
- 2258 again.' Immediately the fig tree withered away."

- 2259 John 4:35 "Do you not say, "There are still four months and then comes the
- 2260 harvest'? Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for
- 2261 they are already white for harvest."

- 2263 laborers are few; therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers

- $2265 \mod \text{has}$ not been unmindful of the good deeds, the self-denying acts, of
- 2266 the church in the past. All are registered on high. But these are not
- 2267 enough. These will not save the church when she ceases to fulfill her
- mission. Unless the cruel neglect and indifference manifested in the past shall cease, the church, instead of going from strength to strength, will
- 2270 **continue to degenerate into weakness and formality.** Shall we let this be?
- 2271 Is the dull torpor, the mournful deterioration in love and spiritual zeal, to be
- perpetuated? Is this the condition in which Christ is to find His church? {5T
- 2273 611.2}
- 2274 It is not yet too late to redeem the neglects of the past. Let there be a
- 2275 revival of the first love, the first ardor. Search out the ones you have
- 2276 driven away, bind up by confession the wounds you have made. Come
- 2277 close to the great Heart of pitying love, and let the current of that divine
- 2278 compassion flow into your heart and from you to the hearts of others.... {5T
- 2279 612.3}
- 2280 What can we expect but deterioration in religious life, when the people
- 2281 listen to sermon after sermon, and do not put into practice the
- 2282 instruction given? The ability God has given, if not exercised, will
- degenerate, and men and women unemployed, will become as tools that rust
- 2284 from inaction. {RH February 28, 1893, par. 3}
- 2285 When men use their powers as God directs them to, their talents will
- 2286 increase, their ability will enlarge, and they will have heavenly wisdom
- 2287 in seeking to save those who are lost. But while the church-members
- $2288\,$ are listless, and neglectful of their God-given responsibility, how can
- 2289 they expect to receive the treasure of heaven to impart to others? When 2290 professed Christians feel no burden to enlighten the minds of those who are
- 2290 professed Christians feel no burden to enlighten the minds of those who are 2291 in darkness; **when they fail to make use of the rich grace of Christ, and**
- cease to impart the knowledge they have received, they become selfish,
- 2293 narrow, bigoted, and their capacity to receive more and more heavenly
- 2294 illumination decreases rather than increases. They become less
- 2295 discerning, lose their appreciation of the richness of the heavenly
- 2296 endowment, and failing to value it themselves, they fail to present it to
- 2297 others. It is only as God sees his professed people eager to be laborers
- together with him, that he can impart to them light and grace; for then they will make every interest secondary to the interest of his work and
- they will make every interest secondary to the interest of his work and cause. With such workers the heavenly intelligences will co-operate.
- 2301 **(RH April 4, 1893, par. 9)**
- 2302 The very simplest modes of work should be devised, and set in operation
- among the churches. If members will cooperate with such a plan, and
- 2304 perseveringly carry it out, they will reap a rich reward, for their
- 2305 **experience will grow brighter, their ability will increase through** 2306 **exercise,** and souls will be saved through their efforts. But **if, on the other**

- 2307 hand, the churches are left to their inactivity, Satan will see that they
- are employed. He will pre-occupy the field, and give the members lines
- 2309 of work to do that will engage their energies, kill spirituality, and make
- them fall as dead weights upon the church. {PH007 11.2}
- 2311 Every follower of Christ is to do something in the work, and not to do
- 2312 what you can, is to manifest indifference to the claims of Christ. If you
- 2313 refuse to be a faithful steward working under the Master, then you are
- 2314 following the directions of another leader, and ranging yourself with
- 2315 those who are warring against God. Christ said, "He that is not with me is
- against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad." If we are
- 2317 not active in the service of Christ, we are ranking with those who are in
- 2318 positive hostility against him; for we are in the position of stumbling-
- 2319 blocks. Every means of influence that God has given you should be
- 2320 employed to the utmost. {RH October 30, 1894, par. 8}
- When we give ourselves wholly to God and in our work follow His
- 2322 directions, He makes Himself responsible for its accomplishment. He
- 2323 would not have us conjecture as to the success of our honest endeavors. Not
- 2324 once should we even think of failure. We are to co-operate with One
- 2325 who knows no failure. {COL 363.1}

Failing To Share Our Distinctive Message

- 2328 Ezek. 33:6 "But if the watchman sees the sword coming and does not blow
- the trumpet, and the people are not warned, and the sword comes and takes any person from among them, he is taken away in his iniquity; but his blood
- 2331 I will require at the watchman's hand."
- 2332 Rev. 2:5 "...repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly
- 2333 and remove your lampstand from its."
- 2334 In a clear, determined voice the messenger said, "I ask you what you are
- 2335 doing? O that you could comprehend! O that you could understand the
- 2336 importance of the warning and what it means to you and to the world!
- 2337 If you did understand, if you were filled with the spirit of the One who gave 2338 His life for the life of the world, you would cooperate with Him, making
- 2339 earnest, self-sacrificing efforts to save sinners." {1SM 92.2}
- 2340 "He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar,
- 2341 and the truth is not in him" (1 John 2:4). A great awakening must come to
- 2342 the church. If we only knew, if we only understood, how quickly the
- 2343 spirit of the message would go from church to church. How willingly
- would the possessions of believers be given to support the work of God.
- 2345 God calls upon us to pray and watch unto prayer. Cleanse your homes of 2346 [those things] which have consumed the money that ought to have flowed
- 2346 [those things] which have consumed the money that ought to have flowed 2347 into the Lord's treasury. The light must go forth as a lamp that burneth.
- 2348 Those who bear the message to the world should seek the Lord
- 2349 earnestly, that His Holy Spirit may be abundantly showered upon
- 2350 them. You have no time to lose. Pray for the power of God, that you

2355 Another year has now passed into eternity with its burden of record; and the 2356 light which shone from heaven upon you was to prepare you to arise and 2357 shine, to show forth the praises of God to the world as his commandment-2358 keeping people. Your were to be living witnesses; but if no special 2359 endeavor of a high and holy character bears testimony before the 2360 world, if no higher effort has been made than that which is seen in the 2361 popular churches of the day, then the name of God has not been 2362 honored, and his truth has not been magnified before the world, by 2363 presenting divine credentials in the people who have received great light. If 2364 they have had no greater appreciation of the manifest power of God 2365 than to eat and drink, and rise up to play, as did ancient Israel, then 2366 how can the Lord trust his people with rich and gracious 2367 manifestations? If they act directly contrary in almost every respect to 2368 the known will of God, and are found in carelessness, in levity, in 2369 selfishness, in ambition and pride, corrupting their way before the 2370 Lord, how can be give them another outpouring of the Holy Spirit? 2371 {RH, February 6, 1894 par. 5}

VIII. Confessing On A Practical Basis And Making Things Right

2374 Confess

2375 Lev. 5:5 "... he shall confess that he has sinned in that thing;"

2376 James 5:16 "Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one 2377 another...."

2378 When there are set before us things that are a cross for us to take up. 2379 we can never be one with Christ until we have lifted the cross. It may 2380 be the cross of confession, the cross of repentance, the cross of 2381 humiliation; but whatever it may be, let us remember that in lifting it, 2382 we are one with Christ, partakers of the divine nature. ... {RH May 18,

2383 1905 Par. 7}

2384 When those in our churches commit sins, they should repent of them 2385 before God, and they should also repent of them before their brethren, 2386 asking the pardon that they will be willing to give. Then the light that 2387 shines from the face of Christ will shine upon them. Let us clear the King's 2388 highway; let us plead with God until we know that we have received 2389 pardon. He will give it to us. But if you cover up your sin, you will have 2390 less and less sense of its sinfulness, and you will go on in the same line.

2391 {RH May 18, 1905 Par. 8}

2392 If there are any differences between you and your brethren, for 2393 Christ's sake clear them away. Take up the stumbling-blocks. Clear the 2394 King's highway. If you have done your neighbor a wrong, go to him, and 2395 try to make the matter right. Talk with God, and when you have done this, 2396 you will be able to talk in a Christlike manner to your brother. {GCB, April 2397 2, 1903 par. 13}

2398 If you have made mistakes or errors in judgment or in speech, or if you 2399 have used the precious talent of speech to proclaim the wrong-doings of 2400 others, may God help you to make a change. Humble your hearts before the 2401 Lord. Do not feel that your brethren will lose confidence in you if you 2402 make confession of sin. We are all finite. We are God's little children. Do 2403 not feel that it would lower your dignity to confess your sins. Christ 2404 says, "Except ve be converted, and become as little children, ve shall not 2405 enter into the kingdom of heaven."
